

What to Pack:

-Bible & pen

-at least 1 t-shirt for each day

-a hoodie/jacket (nights get cool)

-loose knee-length shorts or slacks

-swimsuit & t-shirt and shorts to walk to/from beach

(dark t-shirt and shorts for water wars)

-sleeping bag & pillow

-shoes: gym shoes, tennis shoes (field

games), flip flops (for shower & beach)

-camera (no phone cameras)

-flashlight

-insect repellant & sunscreen

-toiletries & towels (shower & beach)

-spending money on Camper Wallet before arrival

for coffee shop, snack shop, & camp store

*Optional but encouraged for evening services-

Girls: dress/skirt & Boys: polo

A general rule for ALL guests is clothing covers from the neck to the knees and is loose.



What NOT to Pack:

Cell phones, electronic and media devices, magazines, gaming systems/devices, alcohol, cigarettes, vapes, drugs, knives, firearms, or other weapons, nonprescription drugs, paintballs, fireworks

Check-In Health Check

Upon arrival, all campers must go through Health Check before being admitted to camp. This includes Medication Turn-in at Health Check.

Medication Turn-in: No medications may be in the cabin. All medications must be turned into the Health Tech team to be administered at the appropriate time. ALL medications must come in their original bottles (no M/T/W/TH/F/S/S pill boxes). We suggest camper's medication come in a gallon-size bag with his/her name and any notes from the parent inside. If the Health Tech team has questions, they will call the phone number submitted on the registration form.

Health Check also includes the Health Tech Team asking each camper if he/she requires an EpiPen or rescue inhaler, has had any recent illnesses, and is coming to camp well. Lastly, each camper will have his/her head checked to be sure there are no lice/nits. This is done quickly and carefully with great care for the camper and the week-long cabin experience at camp.

Cashless at Camp

We are encouraging ALL campers to put their spending money for the camp stores in their Camper Wallet BEFORE arrival. This can be done through the registration portal. Parents are able to log into the registration portal during camp to see what campers spend and can add to the account if desired.

If a camper arrives with cash, he/she will have to wait in line to turn cash in at registration check-in. Campers will NOT be allowed to pay with cash in the camp stores. Cash can be used for pop machines and offering, but there will also be pop available in the stores, and offering can be given by debit on the camp wallet form filled out by the counselor before the service.

Please indicate on the Cashless at Camp form if you would like money left in the Camper Wallet at the end of the week to be refunded to the card on the account or donated to a camper activity for summer 2026. (Remaining funds will be rounded down to the nearest dollar).

Our goal is to speed up store lines and reduce lost/stolen money for campers. Please leave valuables and large amounts of cash at home.
